Why organize “by state” for Universal Health Care?

- ❖ **Our struggle for the “right to health care” follows the precedent** of a long state-by-state struggle for the “right to education”. Our opposition uses many of the identical opposing arguments used 200 years ago against the “right to education”.
- ❖ **Only broad public education** around the “right to health care” will be able to safeguard high quality health care for everyone. Those left outside the present system must be empowered to defend their rights.
- ❖ **Grassroots organizing will be more effective** at the state level to force a legislative solution.
- ❖ **National acceptance of the “right to health care”** can be built by achievements in states.
- ❖ **Early successes in a few states** will demonstrate the feasibility.
- ❖ **The scale of economy is feasible,** matching in many cases the size of nations which enjoy UHC.
